Dear Parents/Carers,

Attendance and persistent absence

It is really disappointing that attendance has dropped and that our persistent absence has increased this term. Persistent absence is when a child's attendance is less than 90%. One of the main reasons for this is some families taking extended leave over the Christmas holidays which has had a significant negative impact on our attendance figures. Please note that holidays during term times will not be authorised, and we will be issuing penalty notices to families who take holidays during the term—these are £60 per parent per child, so they will soon add up! Please do support us in ensuring that we have attendance figures to be proud of. For any child whose attendance is below 90%, their parents will be asked to attend a panel meeting with a member of the senior management team and school governor. If you would like to know your child's attendance, please do ask

would like to know your child's attendance, please do ask. Please also note that good attendance is 96% or over—this means children need to have less than 8 days off over the whole school year in order to have good attendance.

Parents' evening

On Wednesday February 26th, we will be holding Parents' evening. This is the second parents' evening of the year, and gives you an opportunity to meet with your child's teacher and review the progress your child has made since the last parents' evening. It also gives you a chance to look through your child's work and celebrate their achievements. 
